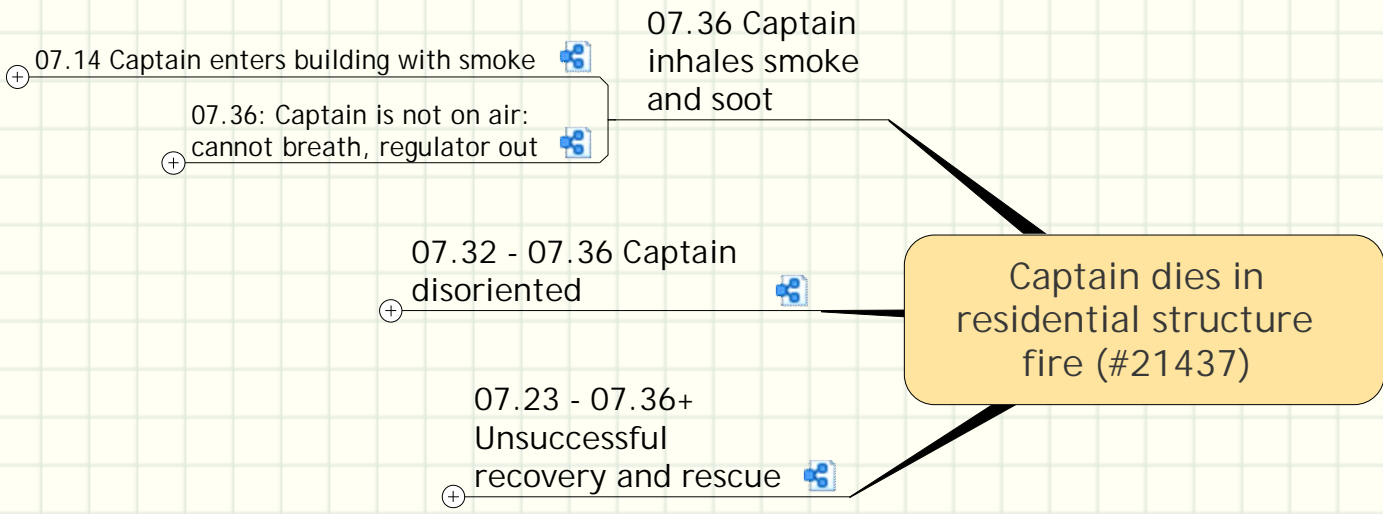
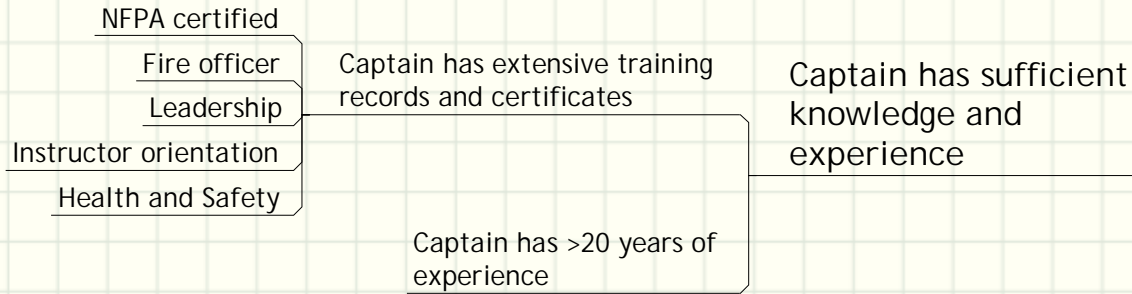

*Technical failure causing reduced time between low air alarm and actual loss of air?*

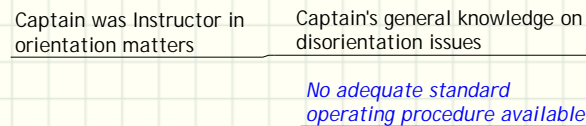
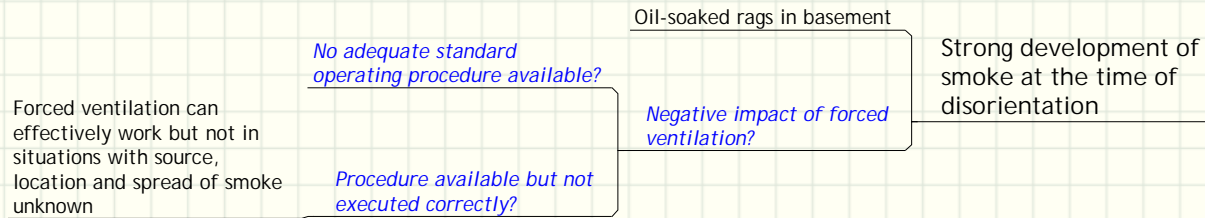

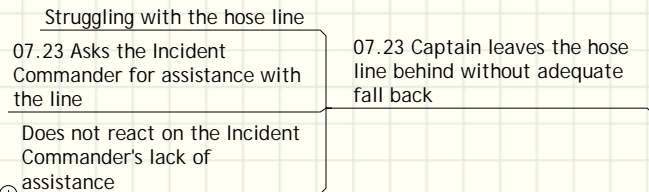
07.32 - 07.36 Captain does not respond on low air alarm

07.36 Loss of air

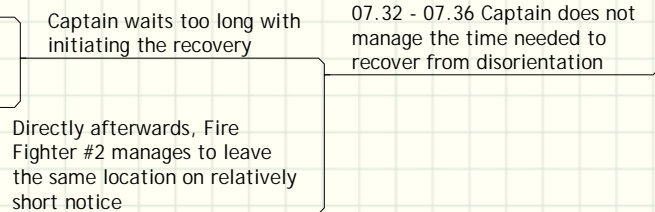


07.14 - 07.36 Captain does not take precautions on missing knowledge of the source, location and spreading of smoke and fire



0732 - 07.36 Captain does not respond adequately after calling for assistance, being lost with Fire Fighter #2 at 2nd floor

07.36 At the time of Mayday, recovery is physically impossible
